Global Classroom | Impact Report 2020-2021



2020-2021 was a year of transition for the World Affairs Council - Seattle due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Like many organizations, we transitioned to remote work and adapted our programming and events to the virtual sphere. While this transition presented challenges to our work such as the postponement of in-person international exchange programs, school shutdowns and remote learning, limited access to our office space, and more, it also helped us to expand our reach to partners, stakeholders, and community members we had not been accessible to in the past.

During the 2020-2021 virtual program year, Global Classroom successfully developed and implemented three times as many programs than the year prior. We updated our curriculum resource guides to ensure they were accessible and user friendly for educators and students navigating online/e-learning during this time and expanded our impact to schools and partners outside of the Greater Seattle Area including school districts in rural Washington and educators from thirteen different states and three Canadian territories. We were also able to engage with speakers inaccessible to us in the past, improving our ability to center BIPOC and Women's voices within our Global Classroom programs. As we enter into "Junior Year" of the pandemic, Global Classroom looks forward to continuing to innovate our programs and resources to support those furthest from educational justice and provide teachers and students with exciting, engaging, and timely global education opportunities to help bring the world into the classroom. *Take a look at our impact!*


