The Taliban had ordered all the girls and women in Afghanistan to stay inside their homes. They even forbade girls to go to school."(Ellis, 1)

Today the literacy rate—the rate of education—of women in Afghanistan is 12.6% and the literacy rate of men is 43.1%. This is an issue because women need to be educated. When women are educated it is easier for them to get a job and pay for health care. When they are educated, girls and women are more likely to marry later, have healthier families, and thus will likely live longer.

Today more women and children die in childbirth in Afghanistan than anywhere else in the world, but they can also get hurt for other reasons. Malala Yousufzai, a schoolgirl in Pakistan, was shot in the head while coming home from school, by a Taliban, because the Taliban did not want her, a girl, going to school. This proves that women should be educated legally so they can learn safely. Mala may

have been going to school, but she did not have the same education as boys. They are educated safely, without fear. Luckily, Malala lived, but she was injured for a considerable amount of time. Since women and girls are not being educated, they marry and have children earlier. This is another reason why women not being educated is a problem. If females had the same education as males it would be likely that less women and children would get hurt, go through the struggles they do, become sick, or die.

Kids should read <u>The Breadwinner</u> because it is a great book. Here are three reasons of many why kids and adults should read Deborah Eliss' amazing book. One reason is it gives kids a chance to learn about a different place.
