COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

Community Programs is the platform through which the World Affairs Council engages its members and the greater Seattle community by providing opportunities for discussion, dialogue, and debate on global issues. The Council is nonpartisan and hosts events on a broad range of issues that feature experts with diverse perspectives. In 2019, Community Programs hosted events that offered frequent opportunities for community members to become more knowledgeable about international issues and how they resonate in Seattle. Members were inspired to learn more and to become more connected to others who share an interest in global issues and the roles of the United States and Seattle in the international community.

Events

The Council's events are formatted as discussions, rather than lectures, enabling attendees to engage directly with the speakers and each other. Topics in 2019 included cybersecurity, fake news, extremism, and the environment. Events include panel discussions, town-hall meetings, discussion groups, trivia nights, and networking events as well as highlevel receptions and private gatherings. No matter the size of the program, participants at every event are able to address their specific interests in a meaningful conversation through moderated Q&A. In keeping with its mission, the World Affairs Council created opportunities for the Seattle community to engage and better understand the many global developments that shaped 2019.

The International Visitor Program (IVP) advances global understanding by connecting the Seattle community with emerging leaders from around the world. Through professional and youth exchanges, these people-to-people connections allow emerging leaders to build the foundation for addressing critical global issues. International exchanges allow Seattle residents and visitors alike to recognize their shared values and to powerfully diminish the boundaries of language, culture, and nation.

International Visitor Leadership Program

IVP's core initiative is the U.S. Department of State's International Visitor Leadership Program (IVLP). Launched in 1940, the IVLP helps strengthen U.S. engagement with countries around the world and cultivates lasting relationships by connecting current and emerging foreign leaders with their American counterparts through short-term visits to the United States. Typical exchanges include visits to four U.S. communities over three weeks.

Participants meet with professional counterparts, visit U.S. public and private sector organizations related to their professional field, and participate in cultural and social activities. The World Affairs Council partners with the U.S. Department of State and national program agencies to administer the program in Washington state.

Brazil Youth Ambassador Program (BYAP) 2019

The program aimed to foster relationships among youth from different ethnic, religious, and national groups; and to promote mutual understanding, respect, and collaboration between people in the United States and other countries of the Western Hemisphere.

Ending Gender-Based Violence

January

A group of 7 visitors from Latin America visited Seattle to review best practices for preventing gender-based violence, as well as to discuss techniques to identify forms of gender-based abuse, report abuse, prosecute abusers, and provide assistance and protection to victims of gender-based violence.

Emerging Political and Economic Leaders in North America

January

4 visitors from Canada came to Seattle to connect and foster relationships with state and local representatives in the U.S. to discuss new and continuing efforts in collaboration and understanding in business, entrepreneurship, and trade. They also examines the underlying societal, economic, and political factors that drive their U.S. counterparts' initiatives and views.

Sports for Social Impact

February

A group of 15 sports professionals from Israel came to Seattle on an exchange program that examined the use of sports as a way to counter racism and promote conflict resolution.

Education in the Digital Age

A group of 24 visitors from around the world came to Seattle for an overview of current technological trends in education and to assess how new technologies impact student learning.

Global Economic Cooperation I 2019

February

21 visitors from around the world visited Seattle to examine international economic cooperation and the integration of emerging markets into the world economy. They also examined links between U.S. and foreign financial systems and commodity markets.

Media Training and Professional Journalism Development

February

3 women journalists from Pakistan participated in week-long fellowships with local media organizations. This program aimed to increase the visitors' technical and management capacity to help them assume senior management roles in Pakistan's news media sector.

TESOL Access Exchange

March

7 English language administrators from around the world met with their Seattle counterparts to exchange perspectives and experiences on English language instruction, curricula, trends, and developments in new and innovative teaching practices.

Transforming Education in the Digital Age

March

5 visitors from Armenia came to Seattle to explore the tendencies and successes of e-learning strategies at U.S. education institutions and how technologies are incorporated in the educational process.

English Language Teaching

March

4 visitors from Turkmenistan visited Seattle to learn about interactive tools, distance education, trends in online education, and new teaching methods that blend technology with increased teacher interaction.

International Women of Courage (IWOC) 2019

March

Global Classroom (GC) extends the World Affairs Council's message of global understanding to K-12 classrooms. GC empowers teachers with the tools, knowledge, and perspectives to engage students in global studies, cultivate 21st century skills, and act consciously as informed global citizens. Students' lives will be defined by the world within and beyond our borders, and the Council's goal is to ensure that the education system reflects this reality. GC brings the world to the classroom to ensure that students are prepared to live, work, and play in a world of diverse cultures, histories, and economies.



GC offers teacher training on a variety of relevant international topics. Monthly programs include guest speakers and meaningful discussion, and participants earn teacher clock hours required for continuous education. Educators leave with a greater understanding of global issues and interdisciplinary resources for bringing them into the classroom as well as stronger connections to their colleagues in the greater Seattle community.

Since 2016, Global Classroom has offered a Spring Book Club to provide educators with an opportunity to read highly-acclaimed, relevant literature pertaining to major global issues. Educators are often given the opportunity to meet and discuss the book with the author and are then asked to create a short lesson based around both the book and the issue it addresses.

World Educator Award

Each year, the World Affairs Council honors a local educator who has made exceptional contributions in broadening the global horizons of students and colleagues.


