Benefits

Monthly (September-June) off the record private roundtables with international experts to build greater understanding of global issues with local relevance.

Productive connections and dialogue between participants representing business, government, military, education, and non-profit sectors. Quarterly networking receptions with the cohort to build ties within the group.

Year-long World Affairs Council membership with further opportunities to participate in substantive policy discussions and invite-only receptions.

Access to the Fellows program alumni network where participants continue to drive ongoing conversations, identify new opportunities to strengthen their network, and serve as proactive leaders and bridge builders in their respective communities.
